Kathy worked at various clubs in the city, including the Calgary Winter Club, The Riverside Club, and Bankers Hall Club. Her love of the game resulted in eleven Canadian Masters Squash championships over the years and two Gold Medals at the Worlds Masters Games in the over 65 and over 75 categories. Kathy was inducted into the Canadian Squash Hall of Fame in 2005 as a player and coach. As a lifelong learner and sports enthusiast, she was still playing tennis, padel, and pickleball well into her 80's.

Kathy and her husband were avid gardeners and enjoyed growing and eating from their garden both at home and at their cabin in Windermere. Although she never learned how to formerly read music, she was uniquely gifted in playing the piano by ear and it gave her and her family a lifetime of joy.

Kathy came to faith later in life and was deeply assured of God's love and care for her personally. She enjoyed her community at Varsity Bible Church, delighted in volunteering at Bethany Care centre playing piano and singing with seniors, and took advantage of her membership at the Calgary Winter Club not only playing racket sports but also singing with the Choristers and participating in the Jam Sessions.
